

Five Most Followed Articles of 2011

A tragic mauling of a pregnant Pacifica woman by her pet pit pull. The police search for a missing San Mateo nursing student. The killing of a mountain lion in Redwood City. These were the stories *Patch* readers were eager to follow in 2011.

As the New Year approaches, *Patch* looks back at the five most popular stories based on follow-up requests.

1. **[Fatal Pit Bull Attack](#)**: On Aug. 8, Darla Napora was mauled to death by her pet pit bull terrier. After a multi-agency investigation, the 2-year-old male pit bull was held responsible for the 32-year-old pregnant woman's death.

2. **[Michelle Le Case](#)**: Michelle Hoang Thi Le disappeared May 27 after a nursing class. Police found her car parked a few blocks from the Kaiser Hospital in Hayward the next day with blood stains. After an extensive search and investigation, Le's body was found near Pleasanton and [Giselle Esteban has been indicted for her murder](#).

3. **[Mountain Lion Killing](#)**: In late March authorities killed a mountain lion that wandered into a Redwood City neighborhood. With mountain lion sightings occurring frequently in San Mateo County readers were anxious to keep up on this topic.

4. **[Tsunami Warning](#)**: With a 8.9 magnitude earthquake devastating Japan authorities issued a tsunami warning for the California coast. The tsunami brought big waves but no damage to Pacifica.

5. **[Sharp Park Golf Course Controversy](#)**: The battle between protectors of endangered species and preservers of the Sharp Park Golf Course raged on in 2011, with environmental groups suing the San Francisco Recreation and Parks Department, which manages the course, and a supervisor proposing to turn the greens over to the National Parks Service. Mayor Ed Lee vetoed the legislation earlier this month, so tee times continue for now.
