## No exemptions from pesticide ban

Golf course owners need to realize that even though a person likes golf or is on a mailing list for a golf course, it doesn't mean that they are willing to sacrifice environmental and human health so a company can keep increasing their annual profits.

Things are changing, people are waking up, and corporations can't get away with using scare tactics to contribute to social and environmental degradation any longer. This approach might still work on some, but not me.
