



## Canada *Must* Speed Up The Phase-Out Of Imidacloprid And Ban *All* Neonics

New research confirms that neonicotinoid pesticides (“neonics”) pose serious threats to pollinators and many other beneficial species.

**The Task Force on Systemic Pesticides’ [new assessment](#) shows neonics harm even more creatures! Neonics are a major worldwide threat to biodiversity and ecosystems.**

To prevent further environmental contamination, Canada must act fast and end the use of neonics.

**Health Canada’s Pest Management Regulatory Agency wants to phase out most uses of imidacloprid — but not until 2021 at the earliest! We need to pick up the pace.**

A new law in France bans all neonics starting next year.
