PIXIE turf-type tall fescue (*Festuca arundinacea* also known as *Lolium arundinaceum*) brings improved brown patch resistance and overall quality to turf areas when planted by itself or used in mixtures. It performs best at 2.5 in. or higher (7+ cm) mowing heights making it ideal for home lawns, community parks and athletic fields.

Thoroughly Tested: **PIXIE** has been seeded around the world and tested in independent national trials with proven results. **PIXIE** was ranked #1 for spring and fall percent living ground cover in NTEP Final Report 1997-2000 and out-performed Shenandoah, Safari, Coronado, Anthem II, Apache II, Bulldawg, Regiment and Twilight II. It showed excellent seedling vigor and attractive green color.

Drought Tolerance: **PIXIE** demonstrated excellent drought tolerance and was placed in the top 10% NTEP ranking for turf quality without irrigation.

Disease and Pest Resistance: Earning excellent ratings in brown patch (Kentucky and Oklahoma trials according to NTEP), leaf spot and red thread resistance, **PIXIE** has the upper hand against some other varieties when it comes to disease and pest pressures.

Blends Well: **PIXIE** blends well with Kentucky bluegrass in ratios of 70% to 90% tall fescue by weight. **PIXIE** is best planted in the fall -- at least 4 weeks before the first killing frost.

Seeding Rate: Plant at 6-10 lbs./1000 ft.² (30-50 g/m²)
