SUMMER turf-type tall fescue (*Festuca arundinacea*) scorches the competition with extremely fine leaf texture, excellent turf density and attractive dark green color.

SPECIAL FEATURES

SUMMER stands up to the heat and was selected for its amazingly fine leaf texture, excellent turf density, and quality.

- Summer is noticeably finer textured than other tall fescues.
- Summer has reduced top growth which according to trial data could result in a 20% reduction in mowing. In a 2-year study, Summer averaged 5.95" top growth compared to 7.16" for Pixie.
- Blades are so fine, many people mistake it for Kentucky bluegrass.

AGRONOMIC CHARACTERISTICS

WIDE ADAPTATION: Summer is adapted in temperate and transition regions under high, medium and low input. It performs best at 1 1/2" to 3" (37.5 to 75 mm) height cuts, but has been tested down to 1/2" (12.7 mm).

SUN AND SHADE ADAPTATION: Summer is adapted to full sun and partial shade. Under partial shade, Summer will retain its density and ground cover when perennial ryegrasses and most Kentucky bluegrasses will succumb and thin out.

BLENDS WELL: Summer is the perfect choice alone or matched with other Jacklin

grasses in mixtures and blends for permanent turf in temperate and transition zone climates.

RECOMMENDED SEEDING RATES: Plant at 6-12 lb. per 1000 sq. ft. (30-60 g/m²) or 265-525 lbs. /acre for blends and straights. For mixtures it can be seeded at 80-90% Summer/10-20% Kentucky bluegrass to improve sod strength. Summer is an excellent choice for use on home lawns, parks, or athletic fields, golf course roughs or out of play areas and other community green areas, and industrial and school sites, golf course roughs, and sports fields.
