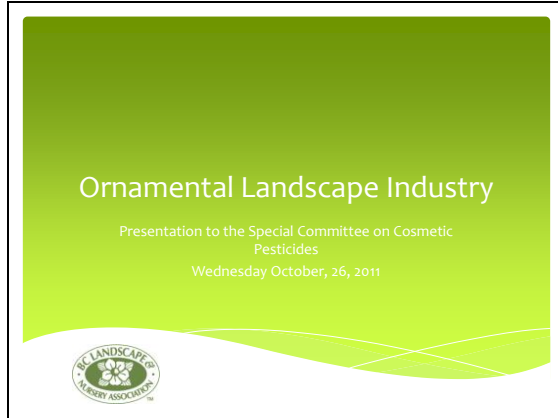

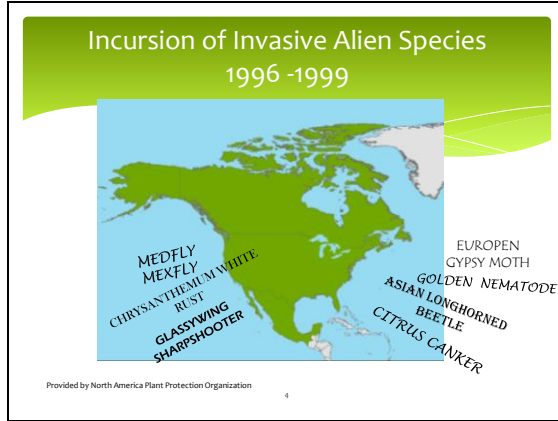

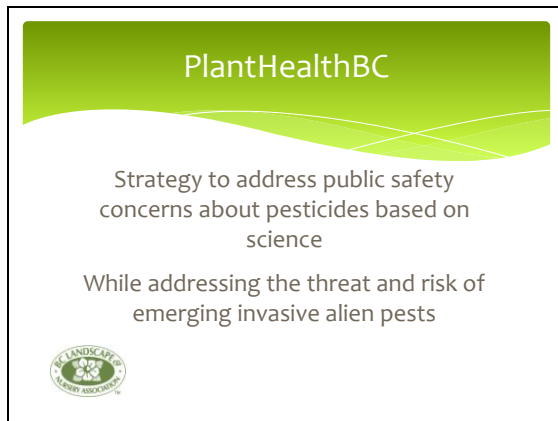

- * Promote plant health and responsible pest management
- * Reduce pesticide use
- * Minimize harm to beneficial insects and organisms

Benefits of the Program –

- * Minimizes pesticide use
- * Enables accredited professionals to control damaging pests and diseases in the landscape
- * Enables accredited professionals to control or eradicate invasive alien species including weeds such as Japanese Knotweed & Giant Hogweed
- * Takes regulated products out of the hands of untrained applicators
