President's Report

This past year, I had the privilege of serving as the 108th president of the Royal Canadian Golf Association. For some, my term will be remembered as the first time in the 116-year storied history of the association that a woman has served as president. While I am extremely honoured and recognize the significance of my appointment, it is another first from 2011 that I am most proud of.

This past year marked the first time that the Canadian golf industry came together to participate in a national government awareness campaign. Representatives from the National Allied Golf Association – comprised of the National Golf Course Owners Association of Canada, the Canadian Golf Course Superintendents Association, the PGA of Canada, the Canadian Society of Club Managers, the Canadian Tour, the Canadian Golf Industry Association and Golf Canada – as well as our provincial association partners participated in government lobby efforts at both the provincial and federal level.

Golf has a great story to tell and our goal was to bring a face and a voice for the Canadian golf industry in front of federal and provincial government; educating legislators across Canada as well as the Canadian public that in addition to health and societal benefits, golf is a significant contributor to the economic well-being of hundreds of communities from coast to coast.

Canada is a golfing nation with close to six million golfers and more than 2,500 courses and practice facilities from coast to coast. As an industry, golf is worth more than \$11 billion to the economy, employs more than 340,000 Canadians and results in \$1.2 billion in property taxes as well as \$1.9 billion in income taxes.

More than 25,000 charity golf events contribute close to \$440 million annually to charity. From an environmental perspective, over 200,000 hectares of green space is managed by golf course operators, including 41,000 hectares of unmanaged wildlife habitat under golf course stewardship. As well, Canadian travelers make more than one million trips involving golf, spending an estimated \$1.9 billion annually on golf-related travel within Canada.

For the first time, our industry was represented as one united voice speaking on behalf of our sport. Cooperation, interactivity and alignment – working together for the betterment of our sport. I was thrilled to take part in lobby days in my home province of Alberta as well as in Ottawa with federal ministers and legislators. I hope the government awareness campaign can be a catalyst for future collaborative efforts in Canadian qolf.

Golf touches so many parts of our lives. I've been a proud member of the Highlands Golf Club in Edmonton for more than 40 years and like many Canadians, the sport is part of my personal and professional life. I believe in giving back. We have accomplished great things within our current resources, and with more revenue sources, we can increase our investment in the game.

Ours is a sport fueled by volunteerism and I want to personally thank the tens of thousands of Canadians that give back to the sport they love. Whether they serve on boards, help conduct championships or clinics, take part in club events or simply lend a hand when needed, volunteers are a driving force in Canadian golf. Having the opportunity to meet and share in the experiences of thousands of volunteers across the country has been inspecting.

I want to thank the entire Golf Canada family including the Board of Directors, our governors and provincial partners as well as Scott Simmons and the staff at Golf House for their efforts, professionalism and leadership.

Serving as the 108th president of this storied association has been a personal highlight in my 25 years as a golf volunteer – a humbling honour and a reminder that whether you are a golfer, an administrator, an industry stakeholder or a volunteer, it is those that love the game that are helping to grow our sport. My enthusiasm for golf has never been stronger and I hope to continue giving back to this game that's meant so much to me.

Executive Director & CEO Report

Golf Canada is looking forward to 2012 and writing the next chapter in our storied 116-year history.

As the National Sport Organization (NSO) for golf and proud member of the Canadian Olympic Committee, we have aligned our strategic plan with the principals of the Canadian Sport Policy – both of which are outlined on the facing page. As an overarching vision, the Canadian Sport Policy is focused on creating a dynamic and leading-edge sport environment that enables all Canadians to experience and enjoy involvement in sport to the extent of their abilities and interests and, for increasing numbers, to perform consistently and successfully at the highest competitive levels.

In alignment with the Canadian Sport Policy, Golf Canada has evolved our strategic plan around four core principals – Grow Participation; Ensure Excellence; Expand Capacity; and Foster Interaction.

1. PARTICIPATION

A significantly higher proportion of Canadians from all segments of society are involved in quality sport activities at all levels and in all forms of participation.

2. EXCELLENCE

The pool of talented athletes has expanded and Canadian athletes and teams are systematically achieving world-class results at the highest levels of international competition through fair and ethical means.

3. CAPACITY

The essential components of an ethically based, athlete/participant centred development system are in place and are continually modernized and strengthened as required.

4. INTERACTION

The components of the sport system are more connected and coordinated as a result of the committed collaboration and communication amongst the stakeholders.

GROW PARTICIPATION:

As the NSO, we have an important role to play in the growth of our sport. As Canadians, we should be proud that our country boasts one of the highest per capita golf participation rates in the world. While past research tells us that more than one in five Canadians plays this great game, a variety of social and economic factors are affecting golf's participation rate. We need new and innovative programming to grow participation and help ensure future generations of golfers.

Golf Canada cannot do it alone; we need the support of golfers and our member clubs to help drive our efforts. Membership has always been core to our business. As we work to grow our membership, we also look to become more relevant to the Canadian golfing masses. We need more golfers who love the game to play a role in helping us grow the sport. As we reach out to new members, we are also focused on solidifying our relationship with our current members and member clubs across the country. It's about better serving our customers and communicating to them the important role that membership dues play in helping to grow the sport of golf.

Together with our provincial partners and the national golf associations, we are focused on getting more children introduced to the game. Our partnerships with industry stakeholders are critical to our success with respect to Long Term Player Development.

We are also committed to growing the Golf in Schools program, which introduces golf through the elementary school physical education curriculum. Our efforts in 2012 will be bolstered thanks to the support of Callaway Golf who has come on board as presenting sponsor. It's about exposure – getting clubs into the hands of children and providing a basic introduction to the sport. In less than three years, the program is in more than 1,300 schools. Our goal is to get golf into the majority of the 10,000 Canadian elementary schools. With a world-class curriculum and the full endorsement of Physical Education Canada, Golf in Schools is helping to introduce thousands of children to the game. In 2012, we also plan to roll out a high school program so that thousands more young adults can maintain a connection to the sport.

CN Future Links Learn to Play is a comprehensive program outlining the detailed steps of junior golf development. The program gets juniors into the system and provides all the tools a club needs to implement a 7-stage approach to learning the game. It's a program developed in partnership with the PGA of Canada and the provinces that is free to all member clubs across the country. We will focus considerable effort in 2012 trying to expand the program, encouraging more facilities to adopt Learn to Play into their junior golf programming.

Increasing access to golf facilities can also have a direct impact on participation. This is where we put our trust in course owners, professionals and general managers that represent a vital touch point with golfers. Access also means connecting with under-represented groups – minorities and adults from all walks of life – and welcoming them to the golf community.

As a recreational, competitive or business related activity, golf has a great story to tell. Promoting the health, societal and economic benefits of our sport to Canadian golfers and legislators is critical to growing participation. With every sport fighting for the attention of Canadians, it's critical to find a way of attracting new players while also remaining relevant to existing enthusiasts.

ENSURE EXCELLENCE

Whether at the playground or on the podium, we are fueled by our NSO mandate to increase excellence in our sport.

Our High Performance Program, as well as those of the provincial associations, continues to develop the future heroes of Canadian golf. Whether through coaching, exercise physiology or sport science, our commitment to developing the future stars of our game is strong and the investment is translating into results. The country's finest amateur athletes continue to accomplish incredible feats both in Canada and internationally as outlined on page 12 of the Annual Report. Athletes like Mackenzie Hughes, Rebecca Lee-Bentham, Albin Choi, Jisoo Keel and the rest of Team Canada made us very proud in 2011

For young athletes, the world of professional golf can be a long and lonely journey. Helping our top Canadians after they make the jump to pro golf is a vital area of athlete development as golf prepares for its inclusion in the Olympic Games beginning in 2016. We have worked closely with the PGA of Canada and Canadian Tour to address the young pro gap and while a program has been developed, unfortunately we do not have the critical financial resources at this time to invest in such an important initiative.

The pathway to Canadian golf excellence is touched by many proud groups including coaches and support staff; provincial high performance programs; organizations like the Canadian Tour, PGA of Canada and amateur golf tours; sponsors and philanthropic donors; family and friends; and most importantly our talented athletes.

Conducting best in class golf championships has been a core mandate throughout our 116-year history. Whether at the professional or amateur level, we are proud to conduct championships that offer a world-class competitive experience to Canadians and international golfers alike.

Performance Measures

2011 marked the fourth year for RBC as title sponsor of the RBC Canadian Open and sixth year of CN's support of the CN Canadian Women's Open. Our National Open Championships are Canada's premier golf showcases that help to raise the profile of our sport. Together with CN, RBC and our many supporting partners, we are committed to making Canada's National Open Championships best in class events. Both championships contribute significantly to charity, allowing us to leave a lasting legacy in our host communities.

Our amateur competitions continue to represent Golf Canada's commitment to excellence as we crowned our newest wave of Canadian champions. International player recruitment, reciprocal exemptions with other premier championships and conducting our championships at the country's finest golf courses remain key to our focus. Conducting world class competitions requires funding and we are fortunate to have a number of sponsors that share our vision for excellence in Canadian golf. Partners such as Royale, RBC, RIM, Acushnet Canada and ClubLink as well as local sponsors in our host communities are vital to the continued growth of our National Amateur Championships.

Whether at the amateur or professional level, our events could not be successful without the commitment of our many thousands of volunteers across the country. They are the backbone of our championships and we are very thankful for their efforts and their passion for the game.

Ensuring excellence touches more than just competitors. We also need to assist the PGA of Canada in the development of more certified golf coaches to assist with player development. The same is true for developing more certified rules officials. The 2012 season brings the next iteration of the Rules of Golf (2012-15) so rules education and certification will be a focus for the season, as will getting a copy of the Easy Guide to the Etiquette and Rules of Golf into the hands of Canadian golfers from coast to coast.

EXPAND CAPACITY

As outlined in our financial statements, the association operated under a \$1.6 million deficit in 2011. Our financials serve as a constant reminder that the viability of our business model relies on finding cost efficiencies and developing additional revenue streams.

We have challenged ourselves to make this association more financially sustainable. We have made difficult decisions for the financial health of the organization but cost cutting is not the answer. The association spends close to \$3 on golf programs and services for every \$1 in revenue generated through member dues, sponsorships, participation fees and Sport Canada funding. It's a reinvestment into the growth of our sport. Creating new revenue sources through merchandising & licensing, e-commerce and the search for new partners looking to affiliate their brand with golf will be a major focus for 2012.

Whether through increased sponsorship, merchandising, government funding or donations, increasing our revenue streams is critical to the health of the organization. We are fortunate to the have the support of nearly 1,500 member clubs and 340,000+ individual members from coast to coast. Not only do clubs provide the 'playing fields' for our sport, the membership dues we collect play a critical role in helping to grow participation and excellence in Canada. It is those clubs and golfers that love and support golf who are helping to grow the game.

While it's important to look ahead at new opportunities, it's equally as important to focus on our role as the governing body of golf in this country. Administering the rules of golf, handicapping, course rating and amateur status while upholding and preserving the storied history of golf in this country remain core to our mandate.

Like any organization, our people – staff, volunteers and supporters – are Golf Canada's greatest asset. They represent the front-line of our brand and our relationship with customers. Others represent the arms of legs of execution and program delivery. I'm proud that many of our former interns are now working full-time in the golf industry – both at Golf Canada and elsewhere. I'm also thankful to the thousands of volunteers that give of their time to help conduct programs and championships. Engaging our people and providing opportunities and training for volunteers and staff will always be an organizational priority.

FOSTER INTERACTION

No organization can single-handedly grow the game of golf in this country. Success can only come if the provincial and allied golf associations and our many stakeholders including media, government and volunteers work together towards common goals. If we work cohesively and collaboratively, the results will follow.

To that point, I want to acknowledge our partners from the National Allied Golf Association (NAGA) – the PGA of Canada, the Canadian Golf Superintendents Association, the Canadian Society of Club Managers, the Canadian Golf Industry Association, the Canadian Tour and the National Golf Course Owners Association of Canada – including their leaders, staff and supporters.

Golf Canada is also proud of our relationship with other golf federations and governing bodies throughout North America and around the world. Having been fortunate to represent Canada at various functions and championship as well as speaking with leaders from the various federations, I have experienced first-hand the level of respect for Canada, our athletes, officials and our programs among our global peers.

The national government awareness campaign that the Canadian golf industry undertook in 2011 and will continue in 2012 saw our industry speak collectively with provincial and federal legislators with a single voice. It was a powerful message to legislators that the societal, health and economic benefits that golf brings to communities across the country cannot be ignored.

Course owners, club managers and professionals have direct contact with Canadian golfers and the strength of our Golf Canada brand lies within those relationships. Our brand is more than the look of our corporate logo or the programs and championships we conduct – it's what our customers think of us. It lies in our responsiveness to questions and our working relationships with those groups and individuals that have entrusted us with a leadership role in the industry. Every conversation and touch point is the extension of that brand.

Golf Canada's relationship with our members and member clubs is key to the strength of our brand. Our ability to communicate with our members has never

been stronger. Our regional membership directors and the provincial golf associations continue to dialogue with member clubs. Every visit or call with PGA of Canada pros, club owners or general managers helps to build those relationships. We want Golf Canada to be a trusted brand – one that engages new participants and inspires Canadian golf enthusiasts to play more and help grow the sport.

We continue to leverage technology and our media partnerships to increase exposure of the Golf Canada brand. Golf Canada has the opportunity to become the country's largest golf community, linked through technology.

In July of 2010, we launched our website – golfcanada. ca – a dynamic online property that has evolved into one of Canada's highest trafficked golf websites. The site continues to be the hub of our engagement with current and potential golf enthusiasts. Developing a database of golfers is key to our communications efforts – the ability to speak directly with our customers.

The golfcanada.ca site also houses our Handicap Network and to the critics that say golfers don't care about maintaining an official handicap, I respectfully disagree. The proof is in the numbers — in 2011, more than 340,000 golfers posted over 8 million scores. Those golfers that tracked their handicap joined thousands more Canadian golf enthusiasts in helping to make golfcanada.ca Canada's most viewed source for golf news.

In addition to Golf Canada magazine and our e-Golf Canada newsletter, social media such as Twitter and Facebook continue to play a larger role in our communications strategy. All that said, 2012 could be a defining year for our sport.

I'm optimistic that the Canadian golf industry is working towards common goals – more people playing golf; fuller tee sheets and more club members; affordable access for the masses; competitive excellence at the amateur and professional level; more children taking up the game; increased revenue at every level; and a greater understanding of the benefits golf brings to Canadian communities. Individual achievements and accolades on and off the course as well as golf's inclusion in the

2016 Olympics will become rallying points for the entire industry.

Will the state of golf have improved a year from now? I can't say for certain, however, if Golf Canada continues to work collaboratively and cohesively with our many industry partners, the likelihood goes up significantly.

When you play on golf courses with official RCGA Course and Slope Ratings® you can determine the relative difficulty of the course and which tees to play for maximum enjoyment. In addition, these ratings are used in calculating your personal RCGA Handicap Factor® so you can measure and track your playing ability and compete fairly with other golfers regardless of their ability.

The RCGA Network provides a nationwide meeting place for Golf Canada members on-line. Scores can be posted to maintain an official RCGA Handicap Factor®, playing statistics can be kept to track improvement and golfers can communicate with other members, clubs and golf associations. The graduated **Rules of Golf** education program provides information about the rules of this unique game. On-line seminars allow interested golfers to learn at their own pace, while more advanced live seminars are available to rules enthusiasts interested in becoming officials.

CN Future Links, Canada's national junior program introduces golf to thousands of children each year. In partnership with the provincial golf associations and the PGA of Canada, almost 950,000 young golfers have participated in CN Future Links activities since 1996. Launched in 2009, the Golf in Schools presented by Callaway program is designed to increase participation at the grassroots level. With learning resources and a world-class curriculum fully endorsed by Physical Education Canada (PHE Canada), the program, currently in more than 1,300 schools across the country, presents an opportunity to expose millions of juniors to the sport through Canada's 10,000 elementary schools.

MAKING CANADA PROUD

The National and Development Team Program – Team Canada – provides the country's top athletes the opportunity to receive world class coaching, training, nutrition and sport psychology advice, as well as international competitive experience. The goal is to help create the next generation of Canadian golf stars.

Conducting **national amateur championships** provides the highest level of competition for Canada's best amateur golfers of all ages.

The CN Canadian Women's Open and the RBC Canadian Open allow Canadian golf fans to witness the highest level of professional competition and inspire our golfing youth to excel. In addition, these events leave an ongoing legacy wherever they are held by contributing hundreds of thousands of dollars annually to local charities.

Our focus is not only the elite golfer. The development of the Long Term Player Development (LTPD) guide for Canadian golf in partnership with the PGA of Canada, provides golfers of all ages and abilities with a comprehensive plan and pathway to reach their maximum potential.

MAKING A DIFFERENCE IN YOUR COMMUNITY AND THE GAME

The RCGA Foundation in 2011 provided \$69,000 in scholarships and \$200,000 in funding to Canadian universities and colleges to provide opportunities for the best and brightest Canadian scholar-athletes with the option to stay in Canada for their post secondary education, while continuing to compete at a high level.

Close to \$300,000 is awarded annually to provincial golf associations for **regional "grow the game" initiatives**, including introducing golf and its unique life lessons through school programs.

In partnership with Canada's National Allied Golf Associations, Golf Canada is **advocating to federal and provincial legislators** on behalf of our member clubs and the Canadian golf industry – communicating the economic benefits of golf as well as the implications of current taxation laws affecting our industry.

Golf Canada provides administrative support and more than \$1.2 million in financial support since 1993 to the Canadian Turfgrass Research Foundation to find alternatives to pesticides and ways to reduce water use on golf courses to improve course conditions while respecting our environment.

Since its inception in 2004, the **Golf Fore the Cure presented by Subaru** program has welcomed more than 63,000 participants and helped to raise more than \$3.2 million in the fight against breast cancer.

The Canadian Golf Hall of Fame and Museum celebrates and preserves the rich history of golf in Canada for future generations of golfers.







Financial Analysis

In 2011, the Royal Canadian Golf Association (operating as Golf Canada) incurred a net loss of \$1,593,933. The financial year of Golf Canada was deemed to be a success despite the deficit realized, with actual results coming in approximately \$400,000 better than budget and almost \$3 million better than the prior year. The improvement compared to budget was due in large part to the effort made to reduce operating costs without impacting the delivery of member services or implementation of our strategic plan. The organization continues to review all of its programs and services including cost structure as well as exploring options for potential new revenue sources.

During 2011, there were a number of good news financial stories to

- Despite a difficult economy and adverse weather in many parts of Canada, membership dues revenue had minimal attrition, providing support of our efforts in improved member communication and support.
- Significant savings resulted from improving the efficiency of program implementation that will also provide cost savings in future years.
- Despite poor market conditions, we hit budget on investment income and the market value of our investment portfolio only decreased by approximately \$400,000 as a result of the conservative nature of our holdings.

The net result of the above noted items is an excess of expenses over revenue for the year of \$1.6 million, compared to \$4.6 million in 2010. At December 31, our overall Surplus stands at \$29.4 million, a decrease from \$31.7 million a year ago as a result of the losses and unrealized losses in our investment portfolio.

During 2011, the Board approved a motion to eliminate the Membership Fund, which was allocated a total amount of \$5 million in 2009, and realize spending in this area as part of normal operations. The plan to build a sustainable membership base through member club retention and recruitment and

growing the number of public golfer members has not changed, but the focus has been shifted based on marketplace learnings from the past two years. The fiscal focus is now reflected in the new financial mandate which commits to breakeven financial performance by 2013 and preservation of capital at amounts in excess of \$25 million

Golf Canada relies heavily on membership dues to perform their role as the National Sport Organization for golf.

MEMBERSHIP DUES


• Membership dues for the 2011 golf season are \$10.00 for every adult golfer and \$5.50 for every junior golfer (approximately 340,000 total members) at each of Golf Canada's 1,448 member clubs. While the membership initiative introduced in 2010 did not increase the membership revenue as anticipated, we are both pleased and encouraged that we did not experience the reduction in membership levels that we had in previous years. This initiative has allowed us to start the process of meeting face-to-face and speaking directly with our members about our role in the development of the sport in Canada, which will continue to be a focus for 2012, working closely with our provincial partners.


SPORT CANADA

Golf Canada is recognized by Sport Canada as the National Sport
Organization for golf, which provides the organization and some of
its athletes in the Player Development Program with the opportunity
to access Sport Canada funding. This funding increased in 2011
as a result of our increased efforts in official language compliance,
along with continued efforts in the area of Sport Development. This
includes the continued rollout of a Golf in Schools program, along
with the increase of coaching and sport science contact days with
our Team Canada members.

2011 FINANCIAL RESULTS

The sources of funding that allow Golf Canada to run our amateur programs and provide member services are as follows:





AMATEUR CHAMPIONSHIPS

 The funding for the national amateur championships comes from three sources – player entry fees, corporate sponsorships and donations through the Amateur Initiative program.

PROGRAM REVENUES

 Golf Canada also generates revenue from sponsorships and participant fees in its other programs, merchandising, and donations.

PROGRAM EXPENSES

As the recognized National Sport Organization for golf, Golf Canada has a responsibility to operate and support programs and initiatives that create awareness and increase participation in golf. In 2011, significant efforts were made to reduce costs while not impacting the delivery of our programs. Golf Canada's expenditures to administer amateur golf programs were \$9.8 million in 2011, compared to \$11.3 million in 2010. A portion of these costs are offset by participation fees and/or program sponsorship fees. However, it is worth noting that the amount spent on programs and services amounts to approximately \$3 for every \$1 collected in membership dues.

THESE EXPENDITURES INCLUDE:

- Sport Development programs including Golf Fore the Cure, High Performance Player Development programs, the Golf in Schools program, and the CN Future Links program (CN Future Links is a national junior golf development program conducted in partnership with the Provincial Golf Associations and the PGA of Canada).
- · The conducting of our national amateur championships.
- Maintenance of the golf infrastructure that oversees the rules of golf, course rating and our national handicap system.
- Continued efforts in club visitation and communication in concert with our Provincial Association partners.
- Conducting initiatives that support the game including golf industry research, rules of golf education, the Canadian Golf Hall of Fame and Museum.
- Providing support to the RCGA Foundation by administering the scholarship program and Canadian university granting program.

CONTRIBUTIONS

In 2011, Golf Canada actively participated in the raising of more than \$4.3 million in contributions (direct or indirect) in support of various charities and other golf related entities.

- At the CN Canadian Women's Open, a combination of the event's ticket sales, on-site fundraising and contributions made by CN through the CN Miracle Match program raised \$2,100,000 for the Montreal Children's Hospital Foundation and the Ste-Justine UHC Foundation.
- The RBC Canadian Open in conjunction with the RBC Foundation made contributions to charities in the amount of \$1,140,000, including a donation to the Mike Weir Foundation in support of children's wellness initiatives
- Golf Canada made contributions of \$180,475 to the various provincial golf associations in the form of grants to fund "grow the game" initiatives.
- Golf Canada contributed \$22,000 toward initiatives conducted by the National Allied Golf Association on behalf of the golf industry in the country.
- The Canadian Turfgrass Research Foundation was given \$25,000 to help them fund research grants to Canadian universities.
- \$652,346 in donations to the Canadian Cancer Society and the Quebec Breast Cancer Foundation was raised through the Golf Fore the Cure program.

 The RCGA Foundation awarded \$200,000 in grants to assist with golf programs at Canadian universities and awarded golf scholarship awards totalling \$69,000.

OTHER OPERATIONS

Golf Canada runs two professional golf tournaments that are Canada's National Open Championships – one is a part of the LPGA Tour and the other is on the PGA TOUR. In 2011, these events operated at a small deficit. Golf Canada also owns and operates a learning centre in Calgary that provided a cash flow of \$162,996 in 2011.

CN CANADIAN WOMEN'S OPEN

The 2011 CN Canadian Women's Open was held at Hillsdale Golf and Country Club in Mirabel, Qubec. The financial impact of this event on the Association's financial statements is minimal, however the amount of money raised for the Montreal Children's Hospital Foundation and the Ste-Justine UHC Foundation through the CN Miracle Match program was an impressive \$2,100,000. The partnership agreement with CN as title sponsor undertakes to have a portion of ticket sales revenue generated from the event given to a local charity and a portion of the surplus used for marketing the following year's event. CN has helped Golf Canada raise the profile of this championship and it is now one of the premier stops on the LPGA Tour.

RBC CANADIAN OPEN

The 2011 RBC Canadian Open was held at Shaughnessy Golf and Country Club in Vancouver. While the event operated at a small deficit, the presentation on site, the corporate support and the support of the host club all contributed to making the event an overall success. As a result of focused efforts by Golf Canada and its key partner, RBC, we were able to collectively contribute \$1.14 million to charities in 2011.

THE GOLF CANADA LEARNING CENTRE

Golf Canada invested in a golf facility in Calgary in 2002 with three key objectives – test and run golf development programs, increase awareness of Golf Canada's role in growing the sport, and provide a positive and continuing cash flow to support our amateur golf programs across the country. The facility has a 9-hole short course, an 18-hole real grass mini-putt course and a driving range with a double-decker hitting stall structure with space for up to 60 patrons including heated stalls to allow for practice and training year-round. During 2011, the facility delivered a cash flow of \$162,996.

INVESTMENT INCOME

The investment policy developed by Golf Canada's Investment Committee and approved by the Board provides guidance for investment decisions. The portfolio comprises a combination of bond and equity funds providing the organization with consistent and conservative income levels. The distributions of investment income from the portfolio continue to be used as a funding source for the daily operations of amateur golf programs. Starting in 2007, new accounting reporting standards required Golf Canada to recognize unrealized gains and losses in the Statement of Changes in Net Assets.

Total investment income recognized in the Statement of Revenue and Expenses is \$1,268,821 compared to a loss of \$864,216 in the prior year. During the year, the Committee took advantage of the changing market conditions to buy and sell equity holdings, which resulted in recognizing gains of \$148,765 on the transactions, compared to losses realized of \$1.8M on similar transactions last year. During 2011, the portfolio's market value decreased by \$404,478 and the value of the forward hedging contracts decreased by \$226,627, leaving an Unrealized Loss on Financial Instruments of \$1,058,564 compared to \$305,219 at this time last year. The total return for the year was 2.5%.

FINANCIAL OUTLOOK FOR 2012 AND BEYOND

For many years Golf Canada was able to rely on net revenues of approximately \$2.0 million annually from the Canadian Open. However, since 2007, the changes in our agreement with the PGA TOUR and related changes to the value of TV coverage has made it difficult for the event to provide the same levels of financial support to the organization, but we expect the event will operate at a breakeven level for the foreseeable future. We strongly believe that the Canadian Open is an important event for Canadian golf fans and we are prepared to continue to operate it on this basis.

During 2011, Golf Canada continued to focus on membership revitalization and growth as our key goal and our number one priority. The membership initiative was implemented during the 2010 golf season and we have seen success with a slight increase in member clubs and public player membership. Our total spending in this area will be reduced, but the organization will continue to focus on delivering superior value to its current members and will increase membership levels by promoting the benefits of membership

The Golf in Schools program continues to grow, now being used in more than 1,300 schools across the country. The program is expected to see continued growth with the addition of Callaway as the presenting sponsor beginning in 2012. We are now working on the introduction of a high school version of this program, with the ultimate goal of introducing more children to golf, and ultimately increasing our potential membership base for the future.

The operating budget for 2012 contemplates a significant reduction in expenses – a result of improved efficiencies that we feel will not impact our delivery of programs along with a reallocation of some funds to improving services or implementation of new sport development initiatives.

During 2011, the Board made a decision to eliminate the Membership Initiative Fund and move the remaining funds back to the reserved funds, and include efforts on membership revitalization as part of normal operations. The Board approved a Financial Mandate that has the goal of at least breaking even, maintaining a minimum of \$25,000,000 in the investment portfolio (including the Golf Canada Learning Centre), and a minimum of \$10,000,000 in near cash holdings.

Guided by the elements of the strategic plan, we are anticipating that Golf Canada can achieve the goal of breakeven in 2013. A planned member dues increase of \$2 per member, starting in 2013, subject to member approval at the Annual General Meeting, along with other new revenue generation plans and continued efforts to streamline operations will all contribute to the achievement of this goal. In the interim, the Board is committed to continue to fund the current programs that support Golf Canada's position as golf's National Sport Organization. The forecasted deficit for 2012 is \$982,000, which includes \$410,000 of amortization.

As the National Sport Organization for golf in Canada, Golf Canada remains committed to our mission of growing participation, excellence and passion in the sport while upholding the integrity and traditions of the game.

Independent Auditor's Report

1. Nature of Operations

The Royal Canadian Golf Association (the Association) operating as Golf Canada is incorporated without share capital under the laws of Canada and is a Registered Canadian Amateur Athletic Association under the Income Tax Act (Canada).

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

(a) Use of Estimates

In preparing the Association's financial statements, management is required to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, the disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and reported amounts of revenue and expenses during the period. Actual results could differ from these estimates.

(b) Financial instruments

Financial assets must be classified as held for trading (HFT), held to maturity (HTM), available-for-sale (AFS), or loans and receivables (L&R). Financial liabilities must be classified as HFT or other financial liabilities (OFL). Financial assets and financial liabilities are initially recorded at fair value with subsequent measurement based on classification.

All financial instruments, including derivatives, are measured at fair value except for L&R, HTM and OFL which are measured at amortized cost using the effective interest rate method. Changes in the fair value of HFT instruments are recognized in the Statement of Revenue and Expenses. Changes in unrealized gains and losses on AFS investments are recognized in the Statement of Changes in Net Assets until realized through sale or other than temporary impairment. Investment income comprising interest, dividends and realized gains and losses is recognized as revenue in the Statement of Revenue and Expenses.

Fair values are based on quoted market prices where available from active markets, otherwise fair values are estimated using a variety of valuation techniques and models.

Transaction costs related to instruments classified as HFT are expensed as incurred. Transaction costs related to AFS, HTM, L&R and OFL are capitalized and are then amortized using the effective interest rate method.

The Association enters into foreign currency futures and forward contracts to manage exposure to foreign currency fluctuations. These financial instruments are designated as cash flow hedges. The hedging relationship must be documented and designated at inception, including how effectiveness is assessed. Effectiveness testing is required on an annual basis. The effective portion of changes in fair value of a derivative designated as a cash flow hedge is recognized in the Statement of Changes in Net Assets while any ineffective portion is recognized in the Statement of Revenue and Expenses.

The Association has classified cash as HFT, receivables as L&R, investments as AFS, and payables and accruals as OFL.

(c) Capital assets and amortization

Rates and bases of amortization applied to write-off the cost less estimated salvage value of capital assets over their estimated useful lives are as follows:

Computer Equipment 50%, declining balance

Leasehold Improvements Straight line over the term of the lease

Furniture and Equipment 25%, declining balance

Golf Canada Centre Straight line over remaining 8 years of the lease

(d) Revenue recognition

The Association follows the deferral method of accounting for contributions. Restricted contributions are recognized as revenue in the year in which the related expenses are incurred. Deferred revenue represents sponsorship and ticket revenues relating to professional tournaments which have been received but not earned. Membership dues are recognized as revenue as fees become due. All other revenue is recognized upon completion of the particular tournament or event.

(e) Donated services

The work of the Association is dependent on the services of many volunteers. Since these services are not normally purchased by the Association and because of the difficulty of determining their fair value, donated services are not recognized in these statements.

(f) Impairment of long-lived assets

Long-lived assets are tested for recoverability whenever events or changes in circumstances indicate that their carrying amounts may not be recoverable. An impairment loss is recognized when the carrying amount of a long-lived asset is not recoverable and exceeds its fair value.

(g) Future accounting policies

On December 31, 2010, the Accounting Standards Board (AcSB) issued Part III of the Accounting Handbook: Accounting Standards for Not-for-Profit Organizations ("ASNPO"). The standards are effective for annual financial statements relating to fiscal years beginning on or after January 1, 2012. The standards are applicable to all not-for-profit organizations. The Association has determined that it will adopt ASNPO but has not yet assessed the impact of these new standards on its financial statements.

3. Financial instruments

Credit risk

The Association is subject to credit risk through trade receivables. Credit risk is minimized by dealing primarily with companies with strong financial positions. The Association maintains provisions for potential credit losses and any such losses to date have been within management's expectations.

Currency risk

The Association is subject to currency risk due to incurring a significant amount of U.S. dollar expenditures. To minimize this risk, the Association enters into U.S. dollar currency forward contracts to manage its exposure to foreign currency fluctuations. The Association also holds a significant portion of funds in U.S. dollars. The foreign currency forward contracts have been designated as effective cash flow hedges and treatment is as disclosed in Note 2(b). At the balance sheet date the RCGA holds U.S. cash of \$475,846 (2010 - \$253,217 U.S.).

Fair values

The fair values of cash, accounts receivable, and accounts payable and accrued liabilities approximate their carrying amounts because of their short term to maturity. The fair value of investments and foreign currency contracts is reflected in the Statement of Financial Position.

Interest Rate Risk

The Association is subject to interest rate risk through its bank indebtedness, debt that bears interest based on the lender's prime rate, which may vary from time to time

The Association's investment portfolio currently resides with two professional investment management firms. The mandate of the Association's Investment Committee includes a review of the portfolio holdings on a regular basis. The investment objectives are to maintain capital, while providing for ongoing operations from the income distributions generated by the portfolio. Under the current Investment Policy Statement approved by the Board, the portfolio maintains a mix of fixed income (which comprises bonds, Mortgage Investment Corporations, cash and cash equivalents) and equities. The policy allows for the market value of the equities to reach a maximum value of 70% of the portfolio (2011: 36.2%, 2010: 34.4%). The intent of this provision is to allow the equity component to be held during significant market fluctuations rather than being forced to rebalance too frequently. The Investment Committee and management obtain input on a regular basis from the Association's professional advisors in making decisions relating to the portfolio.

6. Bank Indebtedness

The Association has a revolving demand facility of \$1,500,000. This facility was not drawn on at year end (2010 - \$50,000). The facility is due upon demand and bears interest at a rate of bank prime plus 0.75% (2011: 3.75%, 2010: 3.75%). As security the Association has pledged its investment portfolio.

7. Contributions to Golf Related Organizations

During 2011, the Association made contributions to the Canadian Turfgrass Research Foundation, the Provincial Golf Associations, the Canadian Junior Golf Association and the National Allied Golf Association.

8. Allocation of Expenses

Administration and Overhead Expenses reported in the Statement of Revenue and Expenses of \$2,679,681 (2010 - \$3,862,450) are reported after allocation of \$379,000 (2010 - \$377,500) to the Professional Tournaments.

b) The Association has entered into forward contracts to hedge against tournament purses to be paid in U.S. dollars in future years. As at October 31, 2011 the Association has committed to purchase \$8,000,000 U.S. (2010 - \$6,000,000 U.S.) at various dates to July 2013. An unrealized foreign exchange loss at the balance sheet date, the liability for which is included in the balance of Accounts Payable and Accrued Liabilities, amounted to \$244,636 (2010 – loss of \$24,280 included in the balance of Accounts Payable and Accrued Liabilities) and this has been reflected through the Statement of Changes in Net Assets.

In 1999, The Board of Governors of the Association designated \$40,000,000 from the sale of the Glen Abbey Golf Course to be used for the betterment of the game of golf in Canada. The following is a summary of the utilization of the funds to date:

The Board has approved that investment income earned from the Designated Funds will be used to fund operations as a replacement for the income that was formerly generated from the operations of Glen Abbey Golf Course.

In addition, with respect to the investment in the Golf Canada Centre, the Board Designated Fund will fully recoup the original allocation of \$3,532,808 by an annual transfer based on amortization of this amount over the term of the lease from Unrestricted to the Board Designated Fund. During 2011, an amount of \$204,141 (2010: \$182,537) has been transferred from Operating Net Assets to Restricted Net Assets.

The Board has approved a Financial Mandate that has the objective for the Association to operate on at least a breakeven basis by 2013 and maintain a minimum market value of \$25,000,000 in the portfolio (including the Golf Canada Centre or other income producing assets) of which a minimum of \$10,000,000 must be in liquid holdings.

(b) Provincial Fund

In honour of the 100th playing of the Canadian Amateur Championship, the RCGA committed an amount of \$500,000 out of the Board Designated Funds toward the Provincial Fund. Money has been distributed annually from this fund to the various Provincial Golf Associations, based on proposals submitted to the RCGA Granting Committee. These funds have supported Grow the Game initiatives that would increase participation in the sport, grow membership and help hire provincial interns to support their initiatives. 12. Membership Fund

In 2009, as a result of a Membership Task Force recommendation, it was decided to focus on revitalization plans to grow membership. In conjunction with this decision, the Board approved and created a Membership Fund and allocated \$5,000,000 to it for the purpose of increasing the number of individual members and member clubs of the Association. The initial transfer of funds represented the expected financial requirement over the following three years to build a sustainable membership base. During 2011, the Board approved the elimination of the Membership Fund by transferring back, to the Board Designated Fund, the balance of the fund as of October 31, 2010 and to account for all membership related costs as part of the Statement of Revenue and Expenses. 13. RCGA Foundation

The Royal Canadian Golf Association controls the RCGA Foundation. The RCGA Foundation was established to raise and grant funds for the advancement of golf in Canada. The Foundation delivers this mandate through Scholarships and Grants. During 2011, the RCGA Foundation awarded a total of \$269,000 in scholarship and grants (2010: \$251,000). The Foundation is a Registered Canadian Amateur Athletic Association under the Income Tax Act.
