**Several municipalities support pesticide ban: society VANCOUVER/CKNW (AM980)**

Thirty municipalities in B.C. have passed motions to support a province-wide ban on lawn and garden pesticides, according to the Canadian Cancer Society.

Director Kathryn Seely says at least 39 communities have their own municipal bans in place, but she says that's not enough, and a province-wide restriction needs to be established.

"We're very concerned about the non-essential use of lawn and garden chemicals on lawns. We know that certain substances in those products have been linked to cancers."

The province is currently consulting the public on a possible ban.

Seely says she hopes the municipal pressure will drive the message home.


