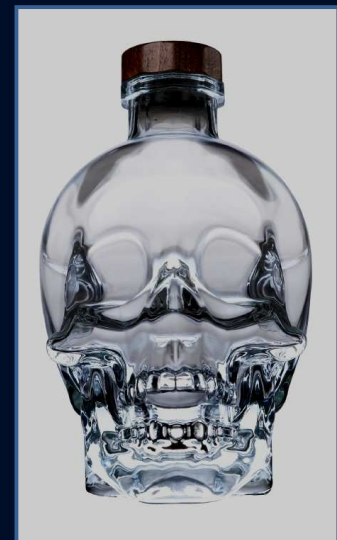

O'Leary is blatantly and consistently WRONG with her opinions and recommendations.

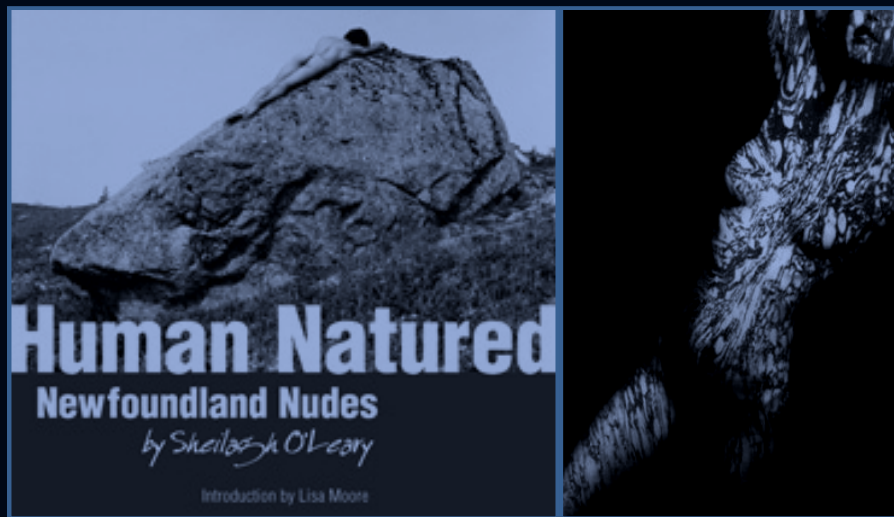
O'Leary's expertise cannot be valid since her educational background is in Fine Arts, and her work background is in Nude Photography.
