## Ontario Government extends Beekeepers Financial Assistance Program to 2015

The ministry has let us know that they have received approval to extend the Beekeepers Financial Assistance program to cover losses in 2015. Although the OBA has been advocating for an increase in the level of compensation, the program is being extended with the same disaster-based parameters as 2014.

OMAFRA will be posting information on the program's extension on its <u>website</u> this week. As with the 2014 program, you will need to report losses to <u>www.agricorp.com/bees</u>.

Agricorp will be mailing application packages to all eligible beekeepers starting next week. The deadline for application is January 30, 2015.

## Update on 2014 Beekeepers Program

All overwinter payments have been mailed for approximately 19,000 hives.

- Total applications: 325
- Overwinter applications paid: 255
- Overwinter payments completed: \$2 M.

First payments for in-season losses have been mailed.

- Total proof of loss forms: 63
- Forms processed: 20
- In season payments to date: \$327 K
