City of Canandaigua pesticide moratorium stays in place for parks

City Council Votes Against Repealing Moratorium On Pesticides In Parks

An eight-year-long debate on the use of pesticides in the city of Canandaigua's parks ended Thursday with the city staying the course.

After a heated volley of opposing positions, City Council members voted not to repeal a five-year pesticide moratorium just a year and a half after it was enacted.

The vote was triggered in early September when City Department of Public Works staff panned the impact of the pesticide moratorium, saying it was three times more expensive, required more labor, and was much less effective than the Integrated Pest Management (IPM) spelled out in the city's 2010 Turf and Landscape Management Policy. That policy was developed in conjunction with Cornell Cooperative Extension and Canandaigua Lake Watershed Council Program Manager Kevin Olvany.

On Tuesday, councilmembers dug their heels in on both sides of the issue.

"One year is too soon to give up and go back to what we were doing before," said Councilmember Jim Terwilliger. "It's far too early for Council to throw in the towel and essentially waive what was a significant piece of legislation for us. I think there are other approaches out there that we haven't tried."

Councilmember Karen White said the council had made a promise to the community last year that they would commit to five years to make parks safe and healthy for pets and families, and she wouldn't be supporting the resolution to repeal the moratorium.

"I don't think relitigating the past is what we're here for," said Councilmember Anita Twitchell. "The important thing is we have to listen to what the people want. Every door I knock on, when I mention that they want to take away the moratorium, people are upset. I'm going to continue to do what the people of Canandaigua want me to do, and honor my commitment."

Councilman Matt Martin said the opposition to repealing the moratorium was perplexing.

"We've heard from our staff, we've heard from the experts, we've heard from everyone involved," he said. "I don't understand the rationale, other than that people are worried about the vote in the fall."

Councilmember Cindy Wade strongly urged colleagues to "use some common sense here."

"I find that this is absolutely ridiculous," said Wade. "If we're worried about the watershed, let's not forget that we have only three parks that actually drain into the Canandaigua Lake watershed. Yet 70 percent of the land that drains into the watershed is agricultural and not regulated by any type of moratorium."

Wade recommended focusing instead on agricultural landowners and the New York State Boat Launch, where 250 boats are launched each weekend.

"I think it's totally irresponsible to maintain this moratorium," said Wade. "We tried it for a year. We heard from our staff that does not recommend this at all."

To Councilmember Dave Whitcomb, the choice was obvious.

"We've spent years discussing this issue, and the result of that is the Integrated Pest Management (IPM)," said Whitcomb. "It allows for some use of pesticides, and it's a very low-frequency dose. It's the result of people much smarter than me, much more knowledgeable than me. And what I do know is you find the right people, you put them in the right positions and they'll make the right decisions."

Canandaigua resident Kathy Rayburn was among many who spoke out from the audience Thursday.

"I was very proud of the city when it enacted the moratorium," said Rayburn. "I just want them to continue to keep at it. I want the city to be a shining light of saying we've done everything we can. But we need the four more years to do that."

A divided council defeated the resolution to repeal the five-year pesticide moratorium.
