Early prevention should keep aphids at bay

Q: I always have a huge problem with aphids on my Virginia creepers. I have six of them along a chain-link fence. I actually got the idea for this fence treatment from a column of yours a few years back. I really like the way the creepers soften the look of the fence, but no matter how often I spray, I can't seem to get ahead of those aphids. What can I do?

A: You may be able to control the aphid problem with a single application of pesticide, if you do it at the right time of the year. Doktor Doom House and Garden is a very good product for this application; it has residual properties, which means it is long-lasting, reducing the need for more frequent applications.

Early in the growing season, spray the fence, wall, trellis or whatever surface the Virginia creeper is growing on as well as the plant itself. Any aphids that are present will die off once they come in contact with any of the treated surfaces. There is some evidence that this treatment acts not only as a pesticide but also as a repellent, because of the active ingredient permethrin.

This same preventive strategy can be applied to ants. Since it looks to be another bad season for ants, it is a good idea to get after them early. This will prevent them from foraging and bringing food back to the nest, feeding the queen and giving her the ability to lay eggs. Use Doktor Doom Residual for this as soon as possible, and you will need fewer applications throughout the rest of the season.

Q: I spend a lot of time watering my beds and containers, and I always take time to water the lawn by hand. Does it need more water than I am giving it?

A: Yes, the water you are applying by hand is not enough. Lawns like to have a deeper watering. You should set a sprinkler and let it run for one to one-and-a-half hours. Because this penetrating watering lasts longer, you won't have to water as frequently. Once a week even during the heat waves is plenty.




