

Professor Keith. R. Solomon, Ph.D.

Professor Keith Solomon is a Professor in the Department of Environmental Biology at the University of Guelph and is also Director of the Centre for Toxicology.

Professor Solomon teaches courses in toxicology and pesticides and ecological risk assessment at the University of Guelph. He directs an active program of research into the fate and effects of pesticides and other substances in the environment, exposure of humans to pesticides and industrial chemicals, and ecological risk assessment. He currently serves on several advisory committees on matters related to environmental toxicology and risk assessment of pesticides and other substances in Canada, the USA, Europe, and for the United Nations Environmental Programme. He is an active member of the Society of Environmental Toxicology and Chemistry, the American Chemical Society, and the Toxicology Forum. He is the recipient of the 1993 Society for Environmental Toxicology and Chemistry award for Environmental Education, was elected as a Fellow of the Academy of Toxicological Sciences in December 1999, and is recipient of the American Chemical Society International Award for Research in Agrochemicals presented by the Agrochemicals Division of the American Chemical Society, 2002.



He is a Graduate of Rhodes University in Chemistry and Zoology and holds M.Sc. degrees from Rhodes University and the University of Illinois as well as a Ph.D. from Illinois. He has more than 30 years of experience in research and teaching in pesticide science and environmental toxicology and has contributed to more than 150 scientific publications and reports in the fields of pesticides, environmental toxicology, and risk assessment.
