

Forty B.C. communities have already banned cosmetic pesticides, including Kelowna, Salmon Arm and Revelstoke, he pointed out.

"We urge the City of Vernon to enact a cosmetic pesticide ban as fast as possible," said Keli Westgate, also with SENS.

She called the pesticides "non-essential chemicals used to beautify lawns and gardens" that tainted water sources and caused unknown damage to bees, birds and waterfowl.

Westgate also pointed out that School District 22 no longer allowed the use of cosmetic pesticides on its properties.

SENS made its first pitch for a ban 17 years ago, and has made four presentations in all to the city.

Cosmetic pesticides are already banned in the District of Coldstream.

"Coldstream uses organic pesticides and manual weed removal in our parks, as decided several years ago," said Mayor Jim Garlick. "Agricultural land will always be exempt due to the right to farm legislation which overrides any local legislation."
