WITTEVEEN, Gordon Cornelis (1934-2010) Gordon Witteveen, iconic golf course superintender passed away December 16th in Southlake Hospital in Newmarket, Ontario of complications arising Born in the Netherlands, Gordon immigrated to Canada at age 20 and, notwithstanding the fact the enrolled in the Ontario Agricultural College (now the University of Guelph), and with encourageme by working during summers he graduated from a program in horticulture in 1958. Gordon coauthored a Maintenance which is in its second printing, has been translated into Spanish, and serves as a tex maintenance programs. A seminar based on the book, The Magic of Greenkeeping, has been pre-America and beyond. He also wrote two books on golf course management history, as well as far at golf course architecture and designed several successful courses still in operation today. Upon 1999, Gordon, with his brother Harry, re-opened a dormant 9-hole golf course (Pleasant View Gol years before near Brantford and owned/operated it until its sale in 2008. He wrote a column, The Last Word for six years and most recently contributed a blog accomplished career superintendent, author, teacher and lecturer, Gordon felt his most lasting an industry was the many young men and women he mentored as assistants or employees who have him guru. Over thirty of Canada's finest superintendents worked for Gordon and currently look afl Canada. He is mourned by his family: his spouse of twenty years, Marilyn; his brothers Harry of E sister Katherine of Cambridge; his children Ann of South Africa, Sidney of Alma, and Margaret of and Geoffrey of Sydney, N.S., and stepdaughter, Janna of Australia; grandchildren Riley and Katic Aidan, Sophie and Morgan of Nova Scotia, Callum and Taten of Seattle, and Josie of Australia.
